POSITION DESCRIPTION

Position: Climbing Wall and Ropes Course Facilitator
Position Reports To: Director of Outdoor Program
Purpose: To provide supervision of girls on the climbing wall and ropes course at Camp Kittamaqund.
Term of Appointment: One year with reappointment based on performance and needs of the council.

Principle Duties and Responsibilities:

Comply with ACCT and insurance guidelines for operating the climbing wall and ropes course at Camp Kittamaqund: Complete ACCT two day course annually. Complete eighteen hours of supervision on the climbing wall or ropes course within thirty days of completion of ACCT course. Within every 90 day period attend quarterly council in-service days or supervise programs at the climbing wall or ropes course.

Maintain ACCT safety standards at the climbing wall and ropes course during all activities.

Inspect safety equipment regularly and submit any faults to the Director of Outdoor Program.

Provide supervision for council, service unit and troop activities at the climbing wall and ropes course throughout the year.

Submit all necessary reports, rosters and evaluations according to agreed upon deadlines.

Interpret and adhere to council and GSUSA policies, standards and guidelines at all times including the council's Affirmative Action Plan of non-discrimination with regard to race, creed, color, sex, national origin, age or special needs.

Present a positive and enthusiastic attitude.

Participate in an evaluation process at least once a year with the Director of Outdoor Program.

Qualifications:

Believe in the aims and purpose of the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. as stated in the promise and law.

Be a currently registered member of GSUSA.

Have the ability to operate a manual belay system and participate in climbing wall and rope course activities.

Maintain Red Cross certification for First Aid for the Professional Rescuer.

Have the ability and sensitivity to conduct programs for people having diverse backgrounds and experiences.
