

Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp

Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp is located on 240 acres along the banks of the Pamunkey River, approximately 25 minutes north of Richmond. A day and resident camp program facility, Pamunkey Ridge features cabins, modern restrooms and dining hall facilities, tennis and basketball courts, a swimming pool, an equestrian center, and a large sports field.

Resident Camp

Check-in: Campers check-in between 2 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. on the opening day of their camp session. Parents and guardians are asked to stay with their daughters until the check-in procedure is completed.

Check-out: A closing ceremony will be held at 2:00 p.m. on the last day of the camp session. Parents, family, and friends are welcome and encouraged to attend. All girls must be picked up no later than 3:30 p.m. (Note: Parents may arrive as early as 1:45 p.m. to collect their daughter's belongings.) **YOU MUST BRING PICTURE ID WITH YOU AT THE TIME OF CHECK-OUT.**

Equestrian Participants: A closing ceremony will be held at 10 a.m. on the last day of the camp session. Parents, family and friends are welcome to attend. All girls should be picked up by 12:00 p.m. (Noon).

Resident Camp Basics:

Girl Scout resident camp is the place for fun, excitement and adventure. With a wide variety of programs, there is something for every girl. Camping activities for all age levels include:

- Swimming at the pool each day
- Canoeing or paddle boating at least once per session
- Preparing a meal of your own outdoors
- Singing and acting at an all-camp campfire
- Creating arts and crafts projects
- Environmental education activities
- Taking responsibility for keeping the campsite clean

Equestrian Resident Camp

Pamunkey Ridge equestrian resident camp gives girls the opportunity to learn aspects of the English riding discipline. Girls will also learn the basics of horse care and grooming. The equestrian staff has a wide variety of experience and knowledge. Some staff are from local areas; others travel from as far as England and Germany. Girls will also take part in traditional camp activities and be assigned cabins according to age. After check-in is complete, the equestrian specialist

will administer a riding competency evaluation. Girls will be placed in groups according to their evaluations. A closing ceremony will be held at 10:00 a.m. on the last day of the camp session.

Pamunkey Ridge Day Camp

Pamunkey Ridge Day Camp will operate Monday-Friday, 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. Parents who choose to provide their own transportation should drop-off and pick-up their daughter at these times. Early arrival and late departures cannot be accommodated. A closing ceremony will be held at 3 p.m. on the last day of the camp session. Parents, family, and friends are welcome and encouraged to attend. The bus transportation schedule is available to girls not riding home with a parent.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: WHERE ARE THE CAMPS?

A1: Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp is located on 240 acres along the shores of the Pamunkey River approximately 25 minutes north of Richmond, VA.

A2: Girl Scout Camp Kittamaqund is located on a 387-acre site in Northumberland County, approximately 80 miles east of Richmond with five miles of shoreline along the Great Wicomico River.

Q: WHAT ARE THE ACCOMMODATIONS?

A1: Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp has two living units containing cabins sleeping eight to fourteen girls each. Modern shower and restroom facilities are also located in each unit.

A2: Girl Scout Camp Kittamaqund has four living units; three units with platform tents sleeping 4 girls and one unit with platform tents sleeping 2 girls. All units contain private open-air hot showers

Q: IF MY CAMPER ATTENDS AN EQUESTRIAN PROGRAM, CAN SHE PARTICIPATE IN OTHER CAMP ACTIVITIES?

A: Yes, girls attending an equestrian program will have time for other activities as well. Although our equestrian programs are designed to be very intensive, your daughter will still have time for playing various sports and games, swimming and participating in other general camp activities.

Q: WILL MY DAUGHTER NEED SPECIAL EQUIPMENT TO ATTEND AN EQUESTRIAN PROGRAM?

A: Yes, all girls in an equestrian program will need to bring boots or shoes with at least a half-inch heel to prevent their feet from sliding through the stirrups. Hiking boots with lug soles, tennis shoes, and sandals will not be allowed. Approved riding helmets for all participants will be provided.

Q: WHEN SHOULD MY DAUGHTER ARRIVE AT CAMP?

A: Resident camp participants will check-in between 2 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. on the opening day of a session. Parent (s) or guardian (s) are asked to stay with their daughter until the check-in procedure is completed.

Q: WHEN WILL MY DAUGHTER BE LEAVING CAMP?

A1: Equestrian Participants: Parents, families and friends are invited to attend a horse show on Fridays at 10 a.m. Girls will be ready for check-out at approximately 12:00 p.m. (Noon)

A2: General Resident Camp Participants: Parents, families and friends are invited to join in a closing ceremony starting promptly at 2:00 p.m. All girls should be picked up by 3:30 p.m. Parents should be sure that all of their daughter's possessions are packed before leaving camp. (Parents may arrive as early as 1:45 p.m. to collect their daughter's
