Silver Award Project



The highest honor a Girl Scout Cadette can achieve. Amanda P.'s Silver project was centered around her interest in camp. She recognized that at Camp Pamunkey there was a lack of storage around the pool area when groups went to swim each day. So Amanda decided to create a storage area that would benefit



campers, counselors, parents & camp staff! Working with GS staff and her team, she built 3 storage units by the pool in 3 different colors, each with 15 crates, held securely in pressure treated wood. Now, girls have a place off the ground to store their items and are less likely to lose items; counselors can now make a quick scan of the colored storage unit to see if their group has left anything behind; parents will have less lost & found to track down at the end of camp; and the grass in front of the pool will now be more visibly appealing to the staff and guests as they move around camp. Amanda worked hard at identifying a problem, developed a plan to solve that problem, and executed the plan.

Wells Fargo Account Holders

This is a timely announcement regarding Troop Bank accounts at Wells Fargo.

It has come to our attention, effective November 15, 2021, Wells Fargo will be converting the Business Choice Checking account product currently held by GSCV troops and Service Units to an Initiate Business Checking account. The new account type will impose a \$10.00 monthly service fee that can be avoided by maintaining a \$500.00 minimum daily balance or a \$1,000 average ledger balance. This is a significant change from the current product, which includes a service fee waiver provision.

Council is working diligently with Wells Fargo to waive the monthly service fee. In the event this service fee cannot be waived, Council is advising troops to open accounts with one of our other partner banks. Should you choose to open an account with another Council partner bank, we will assist in making the transition as convenient and seamless as possible. If any fees are incurred during the transition to another partner bank, please send a copy of your bank statement to Council to be reimbursed for the cost. **The transition needs to occur by December 1, 2021.** Should you decide to stay with Wells Fargo, the service fees will be incurred by your troop or service unit.
