The Girl Scout Leadership Experience

At the heart of everything we do is the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) — a research-backed Program designed to help girls grow into strong, compassionate leaders.

No matter how she participates, every Girl Scout is building confidence, developing new skills, and making a difference in her world.

Through every badge earned, event attended, and adventure explored, she's becoming a leader - her way.

The Five Outcomes of GSLE

When girls participate in Girl Scouts, they thrive in five key ways:

- Strong Sense of Self: She believes in her abilities and knows her worth.
- Positive Values: She acts with honesty, fairness, and kindness.
- Seeks Challenges: She's not afraid to try, fail, and try again.
- Healthy Relationships: She builds supportive friendships and communicates well.
- Community Problem Solving: She takes action to improve her world.

Whether she's a Daisy just starting out or an Ambassador working toward her Gold Award, the GSLE grows with her every step of the way

Badges vs. Patches: What's the Difference?

Badges and fun patches both recognize a girl's participation in Girl Scout experiences — but they serve different purposes and represent different levels of learning.

Badges = Skill-Building

Badges are earned by completing specific sets of hands-on activities tied to Girl Scout Leadership Experience pillars, STEM, Outdoors, Life Skills, and Entrepreneurship. When earned, these should be placed on the front of the uniform sash or vest.

Girl Scouts will earn Entrepreneurship Badges at this year's Cookie Rally! More information on page 24!

Fun Patches = Participation

Fun patches are a way to remember the awesome things you try, like attending an event, helping in your community, or trying something brand new. These are worn on the back of your vest or sash and show your unique adventures as a Girl Scout.

Girl Scouts will receive a fun patch at our Trunk or Treat event on October 24th! More information on page 21.

Troop Member

The most popular Girl Scout experience! Girls join a local troop with others in their grade level — or in a multi-level troop with girls from different grades — to make friends, try new things, and grow together all year long. Troops meet regularly in schools, places of worship, libraries, or community centers - led by supportive volunteers. Together, girls build lifelong friendships, earn badges, explore the outdoors, and take the lead in making the world a better place.

Juliette / Individually Registered Girl Scout (IRG)

Want flexibility? This path is perfect for girls who:

- Don't have a troop nearby
- Have busy or unique schedules
- Prefer to explore on their own timeline

Juliettes are Girl Scouts who participate independently — they still belong to a Girl Scout level (like Daisy, Brownie, etc.), but instead of being in a troop, they chart their own path. They can earn badges, attend council events, join camp experiences, and even take part in the Cookie Program — all on a schedule that works for them.

Juliettes are self-driven and supported by their families and Girl Scout staff to create a leadership experience that fits their life.

- Registration opens Tuesday, August 19th at 6:00 PM.
 Visit www.comgirlscouts.org to view all available Program events and register.
- Registration deadlines are set by the Program Team and typically fall between 7 and 14 calendar days before the event.
- Deadlines are listed in both this Program Guide and MyEvents. Registration will automatically close on the listed deadline and will be enforced to ensure and maintain a quality experience for all registrants.
- All registrations must be completed online to secure your spot.
 GSCV reserves the right to turn away any unregistered participants at the door. We appreciate your understanding as we work to provide safe, highquality events.
- Confirmation emails are sent one week before each event. Please ensure your email address is accurate in your MyGS account.



Cancellations, Transfers, Refunds and Safety Guidelines

We understand that plans change! Here's what to know if you need to cancel your registration:

If You Need to Cancel

- 30+ Days Before the Event: You may request a full refund or transfer your payment to a future event.
- 14-29 Days Before the Event: You may transfer your payment to a future event.
 A \$5 processing fee will apply per girl.
- Less than 14 Days Before the Event: Fees are non-refundable and non-transferable.

If Council Cancels

If GSCV cancels a Program event, all registrants will automatically receive a full refund.

Safety Guidelines

Some events in this guide are girls-only and will be supervised by council staff or approved volunteers. Other events require that adults register and attend with girls.

If an event requires adult participation, the adult must:

- Register for the event
- · Be a current Girl Scout member
- Be at least 18 years old
- Successfully complete a background check in accordance with council policy

All groups must follow the volunteer-to-girl ratios listed below. These ratios show the minimum number of volunteers needed to ensure girls' safety and well-being during events, and are required by GSUSA.

At least two unrelated, approved volunteers must be present at all times. One of these adults must be female, and additional volunteers may be required depending on group size.

Community Partners

Experience Partners offer exclusive access, discounts, or activities that feel extra special because of Girl Scout membership — like museum tours, theater performances, or fun adventures. These may not always align with badge work, but they create meaningful memories.

Service Partners help us connect girls with their communities through impactful service opportunities. These partnerships give girls the chance to make a difference and take action.



Episodic Volunteers

Frequently Asked Questions

Who can register for Program events?

Troop leaders can register their troop (full or partial) through MyEvents. Families can register their Girl Scout and themselves through their MyGS account. "Tagalongs" are non-Girl Scout family members who are invited to join Girl Scout events, often at a reduced registration fee.

Do adults need to be registered members?

Yes. Unless listed as a Family event or otherwise noted, all girls and adults attending an event must be current, registered Girl Scout members.

Certain GSCV events will be open to non-registered family members. *Details on which events* are open to non-registered family members are provided within their respective event descriptions listed in this Program Guide.

Can I drop off my Girl Scout?

Only at events labeled as "drop-off."

Otherwise:

- · Troops must meet girl-to-adult safety ratios.
- · Individually registered girls must attend with a registered adult.
- Family events require a registered adult to attend with the girl.

What if a community partner cancels the event?

Some events are hosted with community partners and may follow their own registration or cancellation policies. If a partner cancels, GSCV will communicate any updates—but is not responsible for third-party changes.

Can I attend if I didn't register for an event?

No. All attendees must be registered in advance. GSCV reserves the right to turn away unregistered participants at the event.

Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp

Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp is located on 240 acres along the banks of the Pamunkey River, about 25 minutes north of Richmond. As a day and resident camp program facility, Pamunkey Ridge features fully enclosed cabins, modern restrooms, a dining hall equipped with a restaurant-quality kitchen, basketball courts, an adventure tower, a swimming pool, and a large sports field.

Camp Kittamaqund Girl Scout Camp, often referred to as Camp Kitty, is located near Heathsville, Virginia, in Northumberland County. The camp spans approximately 387 acres, offering a diverse landscape for various outdoor activities and programs, including hiking, swimming, canoeing, archery, high end arts projects, and environmental education. The facilities include platform tents and common areas for group activities and dining.





Learning lasts a lifetime

Whether you are a new volunteer or a seasoned leader, there are training courses to help you learn and develop the skills you need in your Girl Scout role.

Training is available through online courses in gsLearn or as live virtual or in-person courses. Most training is free for adult volunteers, with the exception of certain in-person certification courses in the areas of archery, paddle sports, axe throwing, etc.

Training plays a pivotal role in preparing all adults who want to volunteer with Girl Scouts. As guided by our national organization, GSUSA, all adults who volunteer for Girl Scouts and in any role that involves working directly with Girl Scouts must be an approved volunteer.

Approved volunteers are registered Girl Scout members who have successfully cleared GSCV's background screening process and completed position-related training. Troop leaders and other adults that will be working directly with Girl Scouts must be an approved volunteer.

As defined in Volunteer Essentials, being an approved volunteer means:

- · They are at least 18 years old
- · Are a registered Girl Scout adult
- · Have completed a background screening
- Have completed all required position-related training



gsLearn

gsLearn is Girl Scouts' official online and on-demand training tool. It empowers volunteers to complete trainings as they work best for them. Volunteers have access to Girl Scout-specific trainings that support consistency across the Girl Scout Movement.

gsLearn is ready for you to access anytime, 24/7. Stop in at your convenience and view your dashboard, which is populated with the latest Girl Scout knowledge and fun troop leader tips.

gsLearn is full of essential volunteer training and courses, like how to lead activities the Girl Scout way, safety procedures, and advice for guiding Girl Scouts at every grade level.

gsLearn is accessible through your MyGS portal and in your home page menu under the Volunteer Toolkit option. The courses available to you are located on your dashboard in gsLearn.

Mandatory Volunteer Training for ALL Girl Scout Volunteers

Protecting the emotional and physical safety and well-being of Girl Scouts is our shared top priority. Your partnership as a volunteer for Girl Scouts of the Commonwealth of Virginia (GSCV) helps to ensure that Girl Scouting here at GSCV is a safe place for all girls. The purpose of the training is to equip volunteers with the knowledge and skills to recognize signs of child abuse or neglect and understand our responsibilities as mandated reporters. Thank you for your continued volunteer service to our council, helping us build girls of courage, confidence, and character who will make the world a better place.

The mandatory training is titled "Girl Scouts Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Course" and is easily located in gsLearn.

Accessing this training:

- 1. Log into your MyGS account.
- 2. Select gsLearn from the left side of the menu on the My Account dashboard.
- 3. The mandatory course should be visible in your course listing. The search feature can also provide a quick option to isolate the course.

What if I can not access gsLearn?

All currently registered adult members with a current completed background check have access to gsLearn through their MyGS account (menu on left side).

Volunteers who are unable to access gsLearn should first check that their Girl Scout membership is current, and their background check is in current and complete status. If the membership and background check are current and complete but gsLearn access is being denied, please contact the GSCV Help Desk at gshelper@comgirlscouts.org. gsLearn is operated by GSUSA and resolving some access issues may be delayed if they require the national organization's exclusive access.

Get Outdoors!

Beginning Camping Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp

Time to get outdoors! The Beginning Camping course is designed for leaders and troops who want to take their troop camping but have little camping experience. Upon completion of this course, you will be certified to take your Girl Scout Troop on a camping trip in the backyard, in a permanent structure such as a state park cabin, or Girl Scout Camp. The course follows progression in the outdoors and is specifically designed for Daisy, Brownie, and Junior Leaders. We can't wait to see you at training! This course takes place on a single day.

Those who want to take their troop tent camping must attend the Intermediate Camping course.

Camp "Kitty" Kittamaqund

Time to get outdoors and camp! The Advanced Camping course is designed for leaders and troop volunteers seeking to take their troop tent camping. This course will give leaders and volunteers handson experiences so they can successfully lead girls on outdoor experiences for multiple nights. Girl Scouts has so much to offer through outdoor experiences, and you will gain knowledge, skills, and practical experience to prepare you to plan and manage overnight camping adventures. You will learn a variety of safety techniques for fires, cooking, and camps. You will also receive valuable tips & tools for fires, cooking, program planning, clean up, packing, and planning. This two-day course includes an overnight at camp and a required prep session, held approximately two weeks prior to the Intermediate Camping course weekend.

*The required prep session will take place in metro Richmond.

Intermediate Camping

*At the time of print training dates were not available. Opportunities for this training will be available in S'more News as well as the registration link.

This course requires a prep session prior to the weekend course. The weekend course is normally a Friday night (optional), Saturday 9:00 AM – Sunday 1:00 PM



First Aid

First aid/CPR certification can be taken locally to support busy schedules and convenience. Following the GSUSA-approved vendor listing below, you



can obtain first aid/CPR training from the following vendors, which offer options in all GSCV regions:

- · American Red Cross
- National Safety Council
- EMP America
- American Heart Association
- American Safety and Health Institute (ASHI)
- Medic

All GSCV regions have first aid/CPR classes offered from the partners above, but your best source of support is your service unit, where you have a network of Girl Scout leaders ready to share their knowledge for resources in your local area!

Volunteers who provide a necessary skill to their troop in being the First Aider often have their training paid by troop funds. In the event the troop funds are not healthy enough to cover the cost, GSCV will help defray costs with up to a \$50 reimbursement each for up to two volunteers per troop every two years.

To request a reimbursement, submit your certification, receipt, and request for first aid/CPR training reimbursement form to gshelper@comgirlscouts.org.

Quick troop tip: A medical professional can also serve as your first aider. They will just need to complete a quick form acknowledging their willingness to serve in that role. Forms can be found on our website under Forms and Publications.

Archery Level I


Archery training is held at Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp

Archery is a Girl Scout staple and a confidence boosting experience for girls. The Level 1 Archery Training is for instructors and those interested in becoming an instructor. In this training, you will become certified to bring this experience to girls in your troop, service unit, and special events!

Adult instructors are required for Girl Scout archery activities, but girls 16 or older are invited to become certified instructors as well. Certification for GSCV's archery program is provided through USA Archery. USA Archery offers Level I Instructor courses in a blended learning format. Volunteers will need to complete the knowledge portion of the course online prior to completing the in-person skills session at Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp.

USA Archery Level I Instructor certification is a required course for volunteers who wish to teach beginning archery skills to Brownies through Ambassadors. In Level 1, participants learn about range safety, range setup, the steps of shooting, equipment, and equipment repair. Girls 16 years of age and older are welcome to participate. This USA Archery certification is valid for three years and renewable online through USA Archery.



Axe Throwing

Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp has an axe throwing range! Volunteers who want to lead this activity with Girl Scout Cadettes, Seniors, or Ambassadors must take the online course: World Axe Throwing League coach certification. Paddle sports: Canoe, Kayak, Paddle boarding

Canoe/Kayak/Standup Paddle Boarding Training is held at Pamunkey Ridge Girl Scout Camp *At the time of print training dates were not available. Opportunities for this training will be available in S'more News as well as the registration link.

This is a 2-day training. Both days are required to be certified.

Watercraft sports are a Girl Scout pastime and a confidence-boosting experience for girls. By taking the Canoe, Kayak, and Standup Paddleboard (SUP) Certification, you will become certified to bring this experience to girls in your troop, service unit, and special events! Certified adult instructors are required for Girl Scout canoeing, kayaking, and SUP.

Virtual


